Institutional Faith Stories

- · Encounter with "The Church"
- · Vague & non-personal language
- · Talk about what they "do"
- Sacramental experiences are transactional and may have intellectual impact

Intentional Faith Stories

- · Encounter with Persons of Trinity
- · Concrete & intimate language
- Talk about how they were transformed, healed, set free, etc.
- Sacramental experiences are tangible and have affective impact


Story Builds Relationship
